Tour 1 - Oklahoma City

Tuesday, November 3

\$65 pp

You're off to explore our state capitol. First stop a tour of our magnificent **capitol building**, learn the history of our new dome. **The National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum** will fill your senses with outstanding collections of Western lore and art a life-sized Western town and of course a great gift shop. Included lunch will be at the museum's restaurant, **Persimmon Hill**. After lunch you will have a Park Ranger guided tour on the grounds of the **Oklahoma City National Memorial**. Followed by a **driving tour**, see Bricktown, Myriad Gardens and the National Stockyards



Tour 2 - American Indians, Amish and a Submarine

Wednesday, November 4

\$65 pp

This tour travels to Muskogee. First stop the **USS Batfish and War Memorial Park**. Tour this highly decorated WWII submarine see military memorabilia and Veterans Walk of Honor. Next on the tour is the **Five Civilized Tribes Museum**. Housed in 1875 Union Indian Agency building; preserving the heritage and cultures of the Cherokee, Creek, Chickasaw, Choctaw & Seminole tribes. Your lunch is included at the home of **Mr. & Mrs. Miller's**. This Amish family serves a family style meal that will surely fill you up. On your way back to Tulsa we make a stop at the **Tulsa Port of Catoosa** to visit the **Arkansas River Historical Museum**.



Tour 3 - Will Rogers, Lynn Riggs, Guns and a Dairy

Wednesday, November 4

\$65 pp

We will drive up Route 66 to Claremore (see the famous Blue Whale on the way). First stop the **Will Rogers Memorial Museum** where you will see Will Rogers gravesite, memorabilia and of course a gift shop. Next is the **Jim Davis Arms & Historical Museum** that includes 20,000 firearms and related items also a collection of steins and swords. Included lunch at the local favorite. A quick stop at the **Lynn Riggs Memorial Museum**. Playwright Lynn Riggs, who wrote "Green Grow The Lilacs," the play used as the basis for the Rogers & Hammerstein musical "Oklahoma!" **Oklahoma Military Academy** tells the story of the more than 10,000 cadets who attended from 1919—1971. In its day, OMA was hailed as the West Point of the Southwest. Next up a tour of the **Swan Brothers Dairy Farm** producer of high-quality dairy products. Last stop today is the **Dog Iron Ranch and Will Rogers birthplace**. 1879 Log-walled, two-story birthplace of famed Cherokee humorist/film star Will Rogers.

DO NOT e-mail housing requests. E-mail is not secure and may expose your credit card information. We will never send or request your credit card information by e-mail.

Name, Address, Phone and e-mail should be for the credit card holder who will be sent confirmations or contacted for clarifications.

A credit card with an expiration date later than 11/09 is required on all housing requests.

Please give e-mail addresses as this will expedite receipt of hotel confirmations. Remember to make the Housing Committee address a non-junk mail address for your e-mail. Confirmation of receipt of the form will only be sent via e-mail.

Hotel assignments will be made starting on April 1, 2009. At this time rooms will be assigned based on the priority groups listed in the table below. Then requests for hotels outside priority groups will be filled based on date received and availability. Please have your request in by April 1, 2009 to assure housing with your preferred group.

Confirmations will contain complete hotel information and rates.

After April 1, 2009 requests will be filled in the order they are received based on availability.

Rooms with 1 or 2 occupants requesting 2 beds may be placed in a room with 1 bed to accommodate requests for rooms for 3 or 4 occupants.

Handicap Accessible should only be marked if **required** and will be filled based on date received. There are a limited number of these rooms in each hotel and you may be moved from your 1st choice hotel to meet the request.

Smoking/non-smoking requests will be filled based on availability. If not marked, a non-smoking room will be assigned unless only smoking rooms are available. When marked, you may be moved from your 1st choice hotel to meet the request.

Any special requests should be made on a separate piece of paper attached to the form (not on the back) and will be fulfilled if possible. You may be moved from your 1st choice hotel to meet the request.

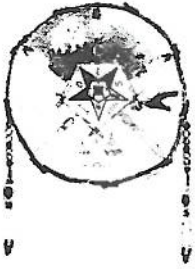

SPECIAL EVENT FOR ALL MASTER MASONS

Indians in Freemasonry go back to before our arrival in Indian Territory. Many of the Principal Chiefs were Freemasons, most of them receiving their degrees in Washington, D. C., or Fort Smith, Arkansas, and some of the very first were raised in England. The early lodges were practically "all-Indian" in membership, with a scattering of military men and post merchants.

During its nearly 60 years of continued existence, the Oklahoma Masonic Indian Degree Team has raised over 950 Master Masons all around the world. At the Triennial Assembly on Tuesday, November 3, 2009, at 7:00 PM in the Tulsa Convention Center they will raise another worthy brother to the sublime degree of a Master Mason. All Master Masons who are registered for the Triennial are invited and welcome to attend. (As this is a Special Communication for the purposes of conferring a degree by a lawfully constituted lodge of Master Masons there is no charge for attendance.)

The degree team consists of Master Masons who also members of various recognized tribes. The tribes represented on the current team are: Apache, Choctaw, Chickasaw, Cherokee, Comanche, Kiowa, Keetoowah, Muscogee Creek, Oneida, Ottawa Seneca/Cayuga, Shawnee and Quapaw. They fill their stations and places in the attire of their respective tribe. The result is an unforgettable experience for both the new Master Mason as well as those in attendance.

STANDING RULES OF THE 46th TRIENNIAL ASSEMBLY, GENERAL GRAND CHAPTER, ORDER OF THE EASTERN STAR

1. **Parliamentary Authority:** “Roberts’s Rules of Order Newly Revised, 10th Edition,” shall govern this Assembly to the extent that it is not inconsistent with the Constitution and Bylaws of General Grand Chapter or with these Standing Rules for the 46th Triennial Assembly.
2. **Credentials Report:** The Credentials Committee, immediately after the Ritualistic Opening, shall report the number of delegates registered and entitled to vote. A supplemental report shall be given each day when called for: and a final report shall be given immediately preceding the election of officers.
3. **Debate and Voting Rights:** Only registered delegates shall be entitled to make motions, debate and vote. At all business sessions, registered delegates shall wear the official badge of the 46th Triennial Assembly issued by the Credentials Committee.
4. **Addressing the Assembly:** To obtain the floor to address the Assembly, the member shall go to the nearest microphone, address the presiding officer, state her or his name, title and jurisdiction and wait for recognition by the presiding officer before proceeding. If desiring to address a question properly before the Assembly, the delegate shall state whether she or he is for or against the question immediately after obtaining the floor. Delegates wishing to make a motion should hold their voting cards above their heads as they approach the microphone.
5. **Business Introduced from the Floor:** Proposed motions from the floor shall be in writing and sent to the platform in triplicate (one for the Most Worthy Grand Matron or, when presiding, the Most Worthy Grand Patron, one for the Right Worthy Grand Secretary, and one for the Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee).
6. **Limitation on Debate:** Debate shall be limited to two minutes for each speaker on each question. The principal proponent of the question will be the first speaker to be recognized if she or he desires to address the Assembly at this time. There shall be no more than three delegates recognized to speak for the question and no more than three delegates recognized to speak against it; and to the extent practicable, they shall be recognized alternately. The principal proponent of the question may speak, however, a second time for an additional two minutes before the vote is taken unless a move of the question has been duly adopted. No other delegate may speak more than once on the same question and no delegate may speak for more than the above allotted time unless permission is granted by the presiding officer or by a two-thirds vote of the votes cast by the registered delegates.

7. Closing Debate (Previous Question): The previous question may be moved to close debate and unless otherwise specified in the motion, shall apply only to the question immediately pending. The delegate must have been recognized by the presiding officer before she or he can obtain the floor to make this motion. This motion is undebatable and requires two-thirds of the votes cast in the affirmative to be adopted.

8. Taking the Vote on Resolutions and other Assembly Business: When a vote is required to dispose of any Resolution or other business before the Assembly, the affirmative and negative of such vote shall be taken on the question. Voting cards will be used when taking the vote, unless otherwise required by the Constitution and Bylaws of the General Grand Chapter or by paragraph 9, below.

9. Requesting a Ballot Vote: Upon motion for vote by ballot, which is not debatable and has been properly made, seconded and adopted by a majority vote upon show of voting cards, a ballot shall be required on any pending question. After any ballot has been closed, business shall proceed while the ballots are being counted. As soon as the ballot count is complete and reported, the result shall be announced by the presiding officer. The ruling of the Chairman of the Tellers regarding the number of valid ballots cast or as to the validity of any individual ballot cast, is final and not subject to appeal.

10. Votes Required: Proposed amendments to the Constitution, the Bylaws, the Rules and Regulations, the Book of Instructions, and the Ritual require two-thirds of the vote cast for adoption. Except as provided in Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, 10th Edition, all other motions require a majority of the votes cast for adoption. A majority of the votes cast is required for election to office but if there is only one nomination for a particular office, election may be made by acclamation as provided in the Constitution.

11. Reports: All reports of committees and other material for the permanent record shall be presented in triplicate (and in electronic format, if possible) to the Right Worthy Grand Secretary before the start of the meeting at which the report is to be given. Committee reports containing only an account of work done or a statement of fact or opinion for the Assembly's information, require no further disposition except for filing and printing in the proceedings, which can be directed by the presiding officer or by general consent of the delegates. All reports of General Grand Chapter Officers and those committee reports requiring action by the Assembly will be referred to the Distribution Committee for distribution to the appropriate committee, and will be voted on after the committee to which it is referred presents its recommendations.
